Next week in school, we have assemblies from the charity Mary's Meals for Years 7-10 on Monday, as well as a bake sale for World Porridge Day on Thursday 10th October. Their mission is that every child receive one daily meal in their place of education and that all those who have more than they need, share with those who lack even the most basic things. They aim to provide porridge to school children in Malawi, Gambia and Zimbabwe to nourish them in order to learn and grow.





To support this, pupil-made flapjack and cakes will be sold during break and lunchtime by some of our school leaders, along with pupils from our neighbours at Sacred Heart. We would love to see as many pupils as possible support this initiative, either by baking or buying some of the cakes sold on the day.

All monies raised will go towards this worthy appeal. In Malawi, after one year of eating Mary's Meals, children were 29 times more likely never to feel hungry while at school than those not receiving Mary's Meals. Just £19.15 can feed a child at school for the entire year. As part of our Catholic ethos, we encourage our young people to consider and support the less fortunate, at home and abroad.


