This year St Bernard's will again be taking part in the annual Keswick to Barrow and Coniston to Barrow events.

The walk this year will take place on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> May. As the course for the K2B will be approximately 40 miles long and the C2B 21 miles, children need to complete some training beforehand so they can survive the distance!

Depending on numbers, the school will arrange transportation by coach to the start of the Coniston to Barrow. **For those wishing to complete the Keswick to Barrow walk, you will need to book a place on the Happy Bus from your preferred pick up point at the time of registering on-line.** Timing tags for the Keswick to Barrow will be distributed on the Friday afternoon before the walk.

Please sign up ASAP if you want to join the team!

All walkers under the age of 17 must commit to raising sponsorship of at least £40. Walkers can be sponsored directly through the Keswick to Barrow website. This should be fully paid in on-line by mid-July.

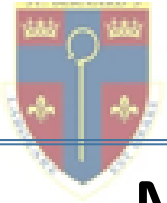
## Road Safety
