SMASHED ALCOHOL EDUCATION TO EMPOWER A GENERATION



GCSE information evening


We had a fantastic evening for our Year 11 families to discuss how best to support them in this important year.



Earlier this week, pupils from both schools joined together to make Rosary bracelets to prepare.


